101 **CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A LEGISLATIVE REVIEW COMMITTEE**
102 **TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING SERVICES FOR**

The bill establishes a 6-member legislative oversight committee on developmental disabilities and autism (committee) and a 25-member task force on developmental disabilities and autism (task force) to examine the Colorado systems that provide services and supports to and across the life

3 **27-10.5-1102. Definitions.** AS USED IN THIS PART 11, UNLESS THE
4 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

5 (1) "COMMITTEE" MEANS THE LEGISLATIVE REVIEW COMMITTEE
6 ON DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND AUTISM CREATED IN SECTION
7 27-10.5-1103.

8 (2) "LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT CASH FUND" MEANS THE CASH
9 FUND CREATED IN SECTION 2-2-1601, C.R.S.

10 (3) "TASK FORCE" MEANS THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND
11 AUTISM TASK FORCE CREATED IN SECTION 27-10.5-1104.

12 **27-10.5-1103. Legislative review committee on developmental**
13 **disabilities and autism - creation - duties.** (1) THERE IS HEREBY
14 CREATED A LEGISLATIVE REVIEW COMMITTEE ON DEVELOPMENTAL
15 DISABILITIES AND AUTISM. THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMITTEE IS TO
16 PROVIDE FOR THE CONTINUING EXPLORATION OF INNOVATIVE WAYS TO
17 STRENGTHEN SYSTEMS THAT PROVIDE SERVICES AND SUPPORTS TO AND
18 ACROSS THE LIFE SPAN OF PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
19 INCLUDING AUTISM.

20 (2) THE COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIST OF SIX MEMBERS. THE
21 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE, THE
22 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND THE MINORITY LEADER
23 OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS OF THE
24 COMMITTEE, AS FOLLOWS:

25 (a) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL APPOINT TWO SENATORS
26 TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE, AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE
27 SHALL APPOINT ONE SENATOR TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE;

1 (b) THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL
2 APPOINT TWO REPRESENTATIVES TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE, AND THE
3 MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SHALL APPOINT
4 ONE REPRESENTATIVE TO SERVE ON THE COMMITTEE.

5 (3) THE APPOINTING OFFICIALS SHALL MAKE THEIR INITIAL
6 APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMITTEE AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER THE
7 CONVENING DATE OF THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SIXTY-EIGHTH
8 GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

9 (4) EACH MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE WHO IS APPOINTED
10 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION SHALL SERVE AT THE
11 PLEASURE OF THE OFFICIAL WHO APPOINTED THE MEMBER. EACH MEMBER
12 OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL SERVE A TWO-YEAR TERM. THE OFFICIAL
13 MAKING THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT OR REAPPOINTMENT SHALL FILL ANY
14 VACANCY BY APPOINTMENT FOR THE REMAINDER OF AN UNEXPIRED TERM.

15 (5) THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE SHALL SELECT THE FIRST CHAIR
16 OF THE COMMITTEE, AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
17 REPRESENTATIVES SHALL SELECT THE FIRST VICE-CHAIR. THE CHAIR AND
18 VICE-CHAIR SHALL ALTERNATE ANNUALLY THEREAFTER BETWEEN THE
19 TWO HOUSES, WITH THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF
20 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SELECTING EITHER THE CHAIR OR THE
21 VICE-CHAIR EACH YEAR. THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE
22 MAY ESTABLISH SUCH ORGANIZATIONAL AND PROCEDURAL RULES AS ARE
23 NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION OF THE COMMITTEE.

24 (6) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWO TIMES EACH YEAR
25 AND AT SUCH OTHER TIMES AS IT DEEMS NECESSARY.

26 (7) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 2-2-307,
27 C.R.S., THE COMMITTEE MAY RECEIVE PAYMENT OF PER DIEM AND

1 REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES AUTHORIZED
2 PURSUANT TO SAID SECTION AND ANY OTHER DIRECT OR INDIRECT COSTS
3 ASSOCIATED WITH THE DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE SET FORTH IN THIS PART
4 11 ONLY FROM MONEYS APPROPRIATED FROM THE LEGISLATIVE
5 DEPARTMENT CASH FUND.

6 (b) THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
7 AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE LEGAL SERVICES MAY
8 SUPPLY STAFF ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMITTEE AS THEY DEEM
9 APPROPRIATE, WITHIN EXISTING APPROPRIATIONS. IF STAFF ASSISTANCE
10 IS NOT AVAILABLE WITHIN EXISTING APPROPRIATIONS, THEN THE DIRECTOR
11 OF RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE
12 OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE LEGAL SERVICES MAY SUPPLY STAFF ASSISTANCE
13 TO THE COMMITTEE ONLY IF MONEYS ARE CREDITED TO THE LEGISLATIVE
14 DEPARTMENT CASH FUND IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO FUND STAFF
15 ASSISTANCE.

16 (8) (a) THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
17 SUPERVISION OF THE TASK FORCE AND SHALL SUBMIT ANNUAL REPORTS TO
18 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE FINDINGS AND
19 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TASK FORCE AND THE COMMITTEE. IN
20 ADDITION, THE COMMITTEE MAY RECOMMEND LEGISLATION THAT SHALL
21 BE TREATED AS BILLS RECOMMENDED BY AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE
22 COMMITTEE FOR PURPOSES OF ANY INTRODUCTION DEADLINES OR BILL
23 LIMITATIONS IMPOSED BY THE JOINT RULES OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

24 (b) THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 24-1-136 (11) (a) (I), C.R.S.,
25 DO NOT APPLY TO THE REPORTS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (8).

26 **27-10.5-1104. Task force on developmental disabilities and**
27 **autism - creation - membership - duties.** (1) (a) THERE IS HEREBY

1 CREATED THE TASK FORCE ON DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND AUTISM.
2 THE PURPOSE OF THE TASK FORCE IS TO ASSIST THE COMMITTEE IN ITS
3 CONTINUING EXPLORATION OF THE COLORADO SYSTEMS THAT PROVIDE
4 SERVICES AND SUPPORTS TO AND ACROSS THE LIFE SPAN OF PERSONS WITH
5 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES INCLUDING AUTISM. THE TASK FORCE
6 SHALL CONSIST OF TWENTY-EIGHT MEMBERS, APPOINTED AS PROVIDED IN
7 PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (1). ALL OF THE MEMBERS OF THE
8 TASK FORCE SHALL BE VOTING MEMBERS.

9 (b) (I) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 15, 2011, THE CHAIR AND
10 VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL APPOINT TWENTY MEMBERS TO THE
11 TASK FORCE AS FOLLOWS:

12 (A) TWO MEMBERS WHO ARE PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL
13 DISABILITIES WHO SHALL BE CONSIDERED SELF-ADVOCATES AND WHO
14 HAVE CURRENT EXPERIENCE WITH THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
15 SYSTEM IN THIS STATE;

16 (B) TWO MEMBERS, ONE OF WHOM IS A PARENT OF A CHILD
17 CURRENTLY RECEIVING SERVICES IN THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES
18 SYSTEM, AND ONE OF WHOM IS A PARENT OF AN ADULT CHILD CURRENTLY
19 RECEIVING SERVICES IN THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SYSTEM;

20 (C) TWO MEMBERS WHO REPRESENT AUTISM OR DISABILITY
21 ADVOCACY ORGANIZATIONS;

22 (D) TWO MEMBERS WHO REPRESENT COMMUNITY CENTERED
23 BOARDS;

24 (E) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A SERVICE PROVIDER THAT
25 PROVIDES SERVICES AND SUPPORTS TO PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL
26 DISABILITIES;

27 (F) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE STATE COUNCIL ON

- 1 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, CREATED IN SECTION 27-10.5-203;
- 2 (G) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A DISTRICT ATTORNEY;
- 3 (H) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A SCHOOL DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE
4 WITH EXPERTISE IN SPECIAL EDUCATION;
- 5 (I) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A PROFESSIONAL
6 ORGANIZATION OF MEDICAL DOCTORS AND WHO HAS EXPERIENCE SERVING
7 CHILDREN OR ADULTS OR BOTH WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES;
- 8 (J) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A UNIVERSITY-AFFILIATED
9 PROGRAM DESIGNATED BY THE FEDERAL ADMINISTRATION ON
10 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES;
- 11 (K) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS AN ORGANIZATION
12 REPRESENTING COMMUNITY-BASED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE
13 PROVIDERS;_____
- 14 (L) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A MENTAL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER WHO
15 HAS EXPERIENCE TREATING CHILDREN OR ADULTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL
16 DISABILITIES;
- 17 (M) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A PROTECTION AND
18 ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION FOR PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL
19 DISABILITIES AND THE ELDERLY;
- 20 (N) ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS A UNIVERSITY-AFFILIATED
21 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES RESEARCH ORGANIZATION;
- 22 (O) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIAL WITH
23 EXPERIENCE IN CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING FOR LOCAL LAW
24 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES; AND
- 25 (P) ONE MEMBER WHO IS A REPRESENTATIVE FROM A COUNTY
26 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES WITH EXPERIENCE IN PROCESSING
27 MEDICAID APPLICATIONS.

1 (II) ON OR BEFORE MARCH 15, 2011, EIGHT MEMBERS SHALL BE
2 APPOINTED TO THE TASK FORCE AS FOLLOWS:

3 (A) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN
4 SERVICES SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE DIVISION
5 WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES THAT GOVERNS SERVICES
6 AND SUPPORTS TO PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES; ONE
7 MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE DIVISION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF
8 HUMAN SERVICES THAT GOVERNS MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES; AND ONE
9 MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE DIVISION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF
10 HUMAN SERVICES THAT GOVERNS VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION;

11 (B) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
12 CARE POLICY AND FINANCING SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER WHO
13 REPRESENTS SAID DEPARTMENT;

14 (C) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
15 REGULATORY AGENCIES SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS
16 THE DIVISION OF INSURANCE WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY
17 AGENCIES;

18 (D) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
19 HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT SHALL APPOINT ONE MEMBER WHO
20 REPRESENTS SAID DEPARTMENT;

21 (E) THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER OF THE OFFICE OF
22 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR SHALL
23 APPOINT ONE MEMBER WHO HAS EXPERIENCE WITH DATA SYSTEM
24 INTEGRATION; AND

25 (F) THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION SHALL APPOINT ONE
26 MEMBER WHO REPRESENTS THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

27 (c) THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL ALSO

1 APPOINT TWO OF THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE AS THE CHAIR AND
2 VICE-CHAIR OF THE TASK FORCE.

3 (d) THE CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE OR THE
4 APPLICABLE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL FILL A VACANCY ON THE TASK
5 FORCE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIMITATIONS
6 SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (1). IN ADDITION, THE
7 CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE OR THE APPLICABLE
8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MAY REMOVE AND REPLACE ANY APPOINTMENT TO
9 THE TASK FORCE MADE PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION
10 (1).

11 (e) IN MAKING APPOINTMENTS TO THE TASK FORCE, THE CHAIR AND
12 VICE-CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL ENSURE THAT, AS MUCH AS
13 PRACTICABLE, THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK FORCE REFLECTS THE
14 DIVERSITY OF THE STATE AND INCLUDES REPRESENTATION FROM ALL
15 AREAS OF THE STATE.

16 (2) THE TASK FORCE SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING FUNCTIONS AND
17 DUTIES:

18 (a) TO DEVELOP STRATEGIES TO MEET THE STATE'S SERVICE AND
19 SUPPORT NEEDS FOR PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES,
20 INCLUDING AUTISM, AND INCLUDING STRATEGIES TO IMPLEMENT THE
21 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AUTISM COMMISSION CREATED BY SENATE
22 BILL 08-163, ENACTED IN 2008;

23 (b) TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE SERVICES AND
24 SUPPORTS FOR PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES INCLUDING
25 AUTISM THROUGH:

26 (1) ENHANCING THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY;

1 (II) ENSURING THAT RESOURCES ARE IN PLACE SO THAT PERSONS
2 WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES CAN EXERCISE SELF-DETERMINATION
3 OVER INDIVIDUAL SERVICE PLANS; AND

4 (III) PROMOTING PERSON-CENTERED PLANNING ACROSS ALL
5 SYSTEMS.

6 (c) TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO REDUCE ADMINISTRATIVE
7 DUPLICATION AMONG DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES OF STATE
8 AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS THAT PROVIDE SERVICES AND SUPPORTS TO
9 PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, INCLUDING AUTISM; AND

10 (d) TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO PROVIDE A COORDINATED
11 NETWORK OF SERVICES AND SUPPORTS ACROSS SYSTEMS FOR PERSONS
12 WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, INCLUDING AUTISM.

13 (3) THE TASK FORCE SHALL PROVIDE GUIDANCE AND MAKE
14 FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COMMITTEE FOR USE IN
15 DEVELOPING REPORTS AND LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS TO MODIFY
16 THE SYSTEMS THAT PROVIDE SERVICES AND SUPPORTS TO PERSONS WITH
17 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, INCLUDING PERSONS WITH AUTISM. IN
18 ADDITION, THE TASK FORCE SHALL:

19 (a) MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR OR MORE OFTEN AS
20 DIRECTED BY THE CHAIR OF THE TASK FORCE;

21 (b) COMMUNICATE WITH AND OBTAIN INPUT FROM GROUPS
22 THROUGHOUT THE STATE THAT ARE AFFECTED BY THE TOPICS IDENTIFIED
23 IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION;

24 (c) CREATE SUBCOMMITTEES AS NEEDED TO CARRY OUT THE
25 DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE. THE SUBCOMMITTEES MAY CONSIST, IN PART,
26 OF PERSONS WHO ARE NOT MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE. SUCH PERSONS
27 MAY VOTE ON MATTERS BEFORE THE SUBCOMMITTEE OF WHICH THE

1 PERSON IS A MEMBER, BUT SHALL NOT BE ENTITLED TO VOTE AT MEETINGS
2 OF THE TASK FORCE.

3 (d) (I) SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE ON OR BEFORE
4 OCTOBER 1, 2011, AND ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 EACH YEAR
5 THEREAFTER, THAT SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NEED NOT BE LIMITED TO:

6 (A) TOPICS TO BE STUDIED IN UPCOMING TASK FORCE MEETINGS
7 AND THE PRIORITIES FOR STUDYING THOSE TOPICS;

8 (B) FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING TOPICS OF
9 PRIOR CONSIDERATION BY THE TASK FORCE; AND

10 (C) LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS OF THE TASK FORCE THAT IDENTIFY
11 THE POLICY SUBJECTS INVOLVED, THE AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
12 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CHANGES, AND THE FUNDING SOURCES
13 REQUIRED FOR SUCH IMPLEMENTATION.

14 (II) THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 24-1-136 (11) (a) (I), C.R.S.,
15 DO NOT APPLY TO THE REPORTS DESCRIBED IN THIS PARAGRAPH (d).

16 (4) MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL SERVE WITHOUT
17 COMPENSATION AND WITHOUT REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

18 (5) THE TASK FORCE MAY WORK WITH OTHER TASK FORCES,
19 COMMITTEES, OR ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE PURSUING POLICY INITIATIVES
20 SIMILAR TO THOSE ADDRESSED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION AND
21 SHALL CONSIDER COLLABORATING WITH SUCH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS TO
22 MOST EFFICIENTLY ADDRESS COMMON POLICY GOALS.

23 **27-10.5-1105. Task force funding - staff support.** (1) THE
24 LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL STAFF, ON BEHALF OF THE TASK FORCE, IS
25 AUTHORIZED TO RECEIVE CONTRIBUTIONS, GRANTS, SERVICES, AND
26 IN-KIND DONATIONS FROM ANY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITY FOR ANY
27 DIRECT OR INDIRECT COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DUTIES OF THE TASK

1 FORCE SET FORTH IN THIS PART 11. THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SHALL
2 TRANSFER ANY MONEYS RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (1) TO
3 THE STATE TREASURER WHO SHALL CREDIT THE MONEYS TO THE
4 LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT CASH FUND FOR USE IN IMPLEMENTING THIS
5 PART 11.

6 (2) THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL,
7 THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE LEGAL SERVICES, THE
8 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, AND THE EXECUTIVE
9 DIRECTORS OF THE OTHER DEPARTMENTS REPRESENTED ON THE TASK
10 FORCE MAY SUPPLY STAFF ASSISTANCE TO THE TASK FORCE AS THEY DEEM
11 APPROPRIATE WITHIN EXISTING APPROPRIATIONS. IF STAFF ASSISTANCE IS
12 NOT AVAILABLE FROM A GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY WITHIN EXISTING
13 APPROPRIATIONS, THEN THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS OF THE DEPARTMENTS
14 REPRESENTED ON THE TASK FORCE, THE DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH OF THE
